G7 FOREIGN MINISTERS MEET IN HIROSHIMA AMID NUCLEAR SAFETY CONCERNS

The G7 foreign ministers have begun talks in the Japanese city of Hiroshima, with John Kerry becoming the first US secretary of state to visit the atombombed city. Terrorism, nuclear disarmament and maritime security are among the topics that the foreign ministers of the Group of Seven industrialized nations are discussing in the western Japanese city on the first of two days of meetings on Sunday.

EU TO DISCUSS IMPOSING

UKRAINE PRIME MINISTER ARSENIY YATSENYUK TO RESIGN

The Ukrainian Prime Minister, Arseniy Yatsenyuk, has announced he will resign next week, blaming politicians' failure to enact "real changes".

Mr Yatsenyuk, in office since former pro-Russian President Viktor Yanukovych was ousted in February 2014, said he would inform parliament on Tuesday.

The current President, Petro Poroshenko, asked him to quit in February, saying he had lost support. His government has been accused of inaction and corruption.

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has threatened to withhold aid money if it does not carry out reforms.

Parliamentary Speaker Volodymyr Groysman has been nominated by Mr Poroshenko's party to replace Mr Yatsenyuk.

Announcing his resignation on Twitter, Mr Yatsenyuk called for the formation of a new government immediately to prevent "destabilization of [the] executive branch during a war".

The government in Kiev is signed up to an uneasy truce with pro-Russian rebels in two of Ukraine's eastern regions, with frequent ceasefire violations reported.

MACEDONIA USES TEAR GAS AND RUBBER BULLETS AGAINST MIGRANTS

Dozens of migrants and refugees were wounded on Sunday when Macedonian police fired tear gas and rubber bullets at crowds on the Greek side of the border. More than 10,000 migrants and refugees have been stranded at the Greek border outpost of Idomeni since February after a cascade of border shutdowns across the Balkans closed off their route to central and western Europe. An earlier attempt by a large group of migrants to cross the border fence had resulted in the confrontation, a Macedonian official said. **READ MORE**

SPAIN FIRES AMBASSADOR TO BELGIUM

Spain dismissed its ambassador to Belgium for inadequate representation, absenteeism and a poor morale at the mission. Ambassador Ignacio Jesus Matellanes Martinez has been relieved of his duties for making no contact with the Belgian government during his appointment in March 2012 and abusing authority "through fear, threat and confrontation," Spanish newspaper El País reported on Saturday.

• 10:00 the Agriculture and Fisheries Council meets in Luxembourg. The Commission is invited to inform ministers of the latest developments concerning agriculture sectors facing particular difficulties. These include the pig meat, dairy and fruit and vegetable sectors. It will also provide information on the implementation of measures listed in the presidency conclusions on market situation and support measures, agreed on 14 March. These measures aim to improve the situation of European farmers. Ministers will exchange views on a regulation to improve the conservation of fishery resources and the protection of marine ecosystems. The Council will also receive an update of discussions on a regulation to improve the collection and use of data in the fisheries sector.

• An **Informal meeting of Ministers responsible for Energy** takes place in Scheepvaartmuseum in Amsterdam today. The energy ministers will discuss regional cooperation on a revised market model for electricity.

EUROPEAN COMMISSION

• On Friday, the European Commission announced €122.5 million for Ethiopia to address the immediate needs of people affected by the worsening humanitarian situation caused by one of the most severe extreme El Niño weather phenomenon on record. This new support aims to combine a humanitarian response and early recovery assistance with initiatives that address the root causes of fragility and vulnerability.

• The European Investment Fund signed **two new SME financing agreements in Italy**: one with Banco Popolare, and one with Banca Popolare di Bari. Together these agreements will provide a further EUR 400 million in finance

to innovative SMEs in Italy over the next two years.

• The European Commission has relieved Deutsche Bahn ahead of schedule from commitments made binding in December 2013, as several competitors have now entered the German railway traction current market, thereby addressing the Commission's competition concerns.

• The European Commission has opened an in-depth probe to verify whether debt write-offs by the Romanian State and continued supplies by Stateowned enterprises in favour of Oltchim, despite the company's deteriorating financial situation, were in line with EU state aid rules.

• The European Commission has approved under the EU Merger Regulation the acquisition of ENI Hungaria Zrt. and ENI Slovenija druzba za trzenje z naftnimi derivati, d.o.o.by MOL Hungarian Oil and Gas Plc..
