

## MARGRETHE VESTAGER SAYS PANAMA PAPERS THE 'TIP OF THE ICEBERG'

The Panama Papers scandal is the "tip of the iceberg" when it comes to wealthy individuals being helped to avoid paying tax, European Competition Commissioner Magrethe Vestager said Monday.

The commissioner told Danish paper Børsen Finans that other companies provide offshore services similar to those performed by Mossack Fonseca, a Panama-based law firm. More than 11 million files from the firm, leaked to German paper Süddeutsche Zeitung, show how national leaders and 140 politicians, their families and associates, used offshore tax havens.

"I thought that I knew about it already, but I was baffled by the extent of it," Vestager said. "My next thought was that it was just the tip of the iceberg. Because there has to be other companies that are advising on how to facilitate offshore companies."

"To me it's not so much about politics or morality, it is more straightforward," the commissioner said. "There are a whole lot of people and companies who just pay their tax. If we all did the same we might need to pay a little less tax and get more out of it."

Russian President Vladimir Putin and Icelandic Prime Minister Sigmundur Davíð Gunnlaugsson are among those caught up in the scandal, along with Ukraine's President Petro Poroshenko, and Saudi Arabia's King Salman.

The French government said Monday that it will seek access to the documents, which were analyzed by the International Consortium of Investigative Journalists in collaboration with media outlets.

#### EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT

• ECR MEPs Anna Fotyga and Mark Demesmaeker host a discussion and presentation of reports on Russian War Crimes in Eastern Ukraine, with speakers including victims, and the Ukrainian Ambassador to the EU (PSH - PIA002).

• ECR MEP Janusz Wojciechowski hosts an exhibition on 'Lodzkie - at the heart of Europe' to showcase the region (PSH - Yehudi Menuhin space).

 Three joint private sector-EU technology projects must do better justifying their use of EU funds in 2014 before the European Parliament approves their accounts, said Budgetary Control Committee MEPs yesterday.

• EU-Turkey relations top the Parliament's agenda this week as the civil liberties committee is set to debate the deal on migration and refugees. It also looks at measures to combat terrorism following the attacks in Brussels on 22 March and the extraordinary summit held by the EU's justice ministers on 24 March. In addition committees also discuss how EU institutions spent the 2014 budget and funding for more staff at Europol's counter-terrorism centre.

#### **EUROPEAN COMMISSION**

· Yesterday, the first resettlements from Turkey and returns from Greece was taking place in the context of the 18 March EU-Turkey Agreement. With this Agreement, EU Heads of State or Government and Turkey agreed to end the irregular migration from Turkey to the EU and replaced it instead with legal channels of resettlement of refugees to the European Union.

• The Commission presented a Nuclear Illustrative Programme. This has been the first report since the Fukushima accident in 2011. The report presents transparent information focusing for the first time on the investments related to post-Fukushima safety upgrades and to the safe operation of existing facilities.

• According to the Eurostat, in February 2016, compared with January 2016, industrial producer prices fell by 0.7% in the euro area (EA19) and by 0.6% in the EU28. In January 2016 prices decreased by 1.1% in both zones.

• The third and largest ever edition of the U-Multirank university ranking has been published today, providing a multi-dimensional overview of over 1,300 universities from more than 90 countries. U-Multirank is the first global ranking allowing users - notably students - to easily compare universities' performance.
