DUTCH GET SECOND CHANCE TO SNUB EU

Referendums make the Dutch establishment nervous. Eleven years ago, the country rejected plans to give the EU greater powers through a European Constitution, embarrassing the government and forcing a rethink in Brussels.

History could repeat itself Wednesday.

When Dutch voters go to the polls to decide whether the EU should work more closely with Ukraine, the stakes will not be as high as they were in 2005. But the government wants desperately to avoid a No vote. It would be awkward coming as the Netherlands holds the rotating presidency of the Council of Ministers. And it could help fuel the Euroskeptic movement across Europe.

For many, this is not a referendum on an EU-Ukraine "association agreement," as the treaty to strengthen economic and political ties is known. It's a vote on the EU and on the Dutch government itself.

Geert Wilders, the controversial leader of the far-right Freedom Party, launched a campaign in March called EUKRAINEE – a combination of EU, Ukraine and Nee (the Dutch word for no).

"This referendum is about more than just the agreement between the EU and Ukraine. It is a chance for the Netherlands to show a counter-message. A vote against the deal equals a vote against [Prime Minister Mark] Rutte and the Brussels elite," says a statement on the Freedom Party's website.

In February 2016 compared with January 2016, the seasonally adjusted volume of retail trade increased by 0.2% in the euro area (EA19) and fell by 0.1% in the EU28, according to estimates from Eurostat. In January retail trade rose by 0.3% in the euro area and by 0.7% in the EU28.

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT

• 10:00 ECR MEP Joachim Starbatty co-hosts a hearing on the Euro, with opening remarks by ECR Vice-President Hans-Olaf Henkel and speakers from think tanks, universities, and MEPs from several political groups (ASP - 1AE2).

• 16:30 President of the European parliament Martin Schulz will meet Irina Bokova, Director-General of UNESCO (PSH, Salon Protocolaire A).

EUROPEAN COMMISSION

• Today, the Commission and the African Union Commission hold their annual College-to-College meeting in Africa's political capital in Addis Ababa. This annual meeting is the biggest EU-Africa political meeting of the year. Discussions will focus on key themes such as migration, peace, security and sustainable growth, as well as other policy areas enshrined in the Joint **EU-Africa Strategy**.

• Yesterday, the Commission announced a €52 million humanitarian aid package aimed specifically at educational projects for children in emergency situations in 2016. The package reflects the Commission's prior commitment to allocate 4% of its humanitarian aid budget to education.

• During a visit to Sudan yesterday, EU Commissioner for International Cooperation and Development, Neven Mimica discussed increased EU cooperation with Sudan on issues of common interest.

• The Commission will invest over €7.5 million to boost innovation and create jobs in the marine and maritime sectors. Innovation in sectors like aquaculture, biotechnology or ocean energy is vital for the blue economy to thrive, as recognised by the Commission's Communication on Innovation in the Blue Economy.

COURT OF JUSTICE OF THE EU

• The Court ruled that the execution of a European arrest warrant must be deferred if there is a real risk of inhuman or degrading treatment because of the conditions of detention of the person concerned in the Member State where the warrant was issued. If the existence of that risk cannot be discounted within a reasonable period, the authority responsible for the execution of the warrant must decide whether the surrender procedure should be brought to an end (C-404/15 and C-659/15 PPU).

• 9:30 The European Political Strategy Centre is hosting a High level Conference 'Europe as an Investment Destination'. Focusing on the key priority of the Juncker Commission, this event will explore how the Investment Plan for Europe and the European Fund for Strategic Investments contribute to Europe's economic recovery while driving innovation, technology and skills.
